Project Name and Effective Date	Health Information Exchange for specified diseases and conditions that are mandated by State laws and regulations to be reported by healthcare providers and laboratories to the California Department of Public Health. Submit patient health data to California Reportable Disease Information Exchange (CaIREDIE) Effective:
Data Submitted for Exchange	Patient laboratory reports and demographic data necessary for identification.
Permitted Uses	County Public Health and their Authorized Users may access the Exchange to provide Data for mandated reporting.
Authorized Users	Authorized Users are employees, independent contractors or agents of County Public Health who (i) have been authenticated and given access in compliance with HIE Policies and Standards by the Participant; (ii) accepts responsibility for compliance with the terms of the Participation Agreement, and (iii) require access to data to facilitate reporting to CaIREDIE.

Certification Requirements	Data submitter must enroll in CaIREDIE (see link above)
Definitions for Project	CaIREDIE is California's project for a PHIN-compliant electronic disease reporting and surveillance system integrated with electronic laboratory reporting (ELR). The purpose of this effort is to improve the efficiency of surveillance activities and the early detection of public health events through the collection of more complete and timely surveillance information on a state wide basis. A secure, web-based electronic solution is implemented for health care providers to report cases of conditions of public health interest; and for laboratories to report laboratory reports for notifiable conditions to local health departments (LHDs) and the CDPH. This will allow for 24/7/365 reporting and receipt of notifiable conditions. LHDs and CDPH have access to disease and laboratory for disease surveillance, public health investigation, and case management activities.
